# REVEREND OLLIE RENCHER

St. Peters Episcopal Parish Church



We had the pleasure today to hear from Reverend Ollie Rencher of St. Peters Episcopal Parish Church. Ollie and his wife arrived at the Parish in September 2012 from Memphis and by way of Oxford, Mississippi. Ollie is a 2003 alumnus of the Theological Episcopal Church of Manhattan. He has had leadership roles in race reconciliation, social justice ministries, community revitalization and is currently quite active in local center city not for profit boards.

Ollie began his comments by stating when we hear the word race, something happens in our bodies. It can make you joyful and you want to talk more, or makes you want to shut down or

perhaps pack it up and leave early. When he hears race he is hopeful that we all see that we are interconnected and when we realize this, a lot can get done. Ollie feels community is the connection about all of us being in common. He becomes hopeful with the power that community can create. He recalled his father as a Rotarian and how Rotary played a role in his life about getting in the ministry, service above self!

He went on to explain how we are connected to one another, but at our foundation we are Imago Dei, all created in the "Image of God." When we interact with any person as broken, beautiful, weak, hopeful and deplorable we are interacting with God. Our city has been fractured recently and he invited all of us to live in hope and for the impossible to be made possible through community.

Ollie shared with us the word Ubuntu, which means "I am because you are, I am broken because you are broken." This is a foundation of self.....we choose to serve/care for people we do not/will never know. We have connection with everyone in community. He suggests we take action and go across the street, reach across the table, invite the stranger who is not like us to be connected to us. Ollie finds great hope in our community and challenges us to go deeper within ourselves because the things we have run from for so long are not going away and it is time to "lean in" and make real change in our community.

Ollie has great joy for what community can do. Energy is high here and we need to leverage this to expand our connectivity to the people who we will never meet in our community. If we all dig a little deeper we can close these divisions in our community. He is encouraged in what he sees in Charlotte, he wants us to all know what Ibuntu feels like. We all must be open with our thoughts and feelings for us to have community we can celebrate. Ollie has a great perspective on an uncomfortable subject for all of us to discuss. Ubunto "I am because you are" and when we know that deeply, community can be formed and we can definitely serve others over ourselves.
