Rotary member Luther Moore introduced this week's speaker – Andy Ellen, President of the North Carolina Retail Merchants Association. Andy came to the NCRMA as general counsel in 1998 and took on the role of President in 2012. He is responsible for the NCRMA and 12 affiliated companies. He is passionate about promoting a positive environment for the retail industry from all aspects – public, legislative and regulatory agencies to enhance his members' opportunities for success. Andy has been named to the Power List of Business NC for

the past 3 years, as well as one of the top five most effective lobbyists in NC by the NC Public Policy Institute many times. He has been recognized by the National Retail Federation, a recipient of the Triangle Business Journal's Corporate Counsel Awards. Andy is originally from Southern Pines, received

his undergraduate degree from Elon University and his Juris Doctorate from Campbell University. He and his wife Tricia live in Wake Forest and have two daughters currently in college.

Andy thanked everyone for having him serve as speaker. Welcome to the club! Many of you may know Velva Woollen from her incredible work in the Charlotte community. Born in High Point, Velva moved to Charlotte at the age of 7. A graduate of East Mecklenburg High School, Salem College, and Duke University, she has lived in various cities but proudly calls Charlotte her home.



Velva's leadership journey began early, as she became the first President of the Board of Directors of Discovery Place. She then served six years as a Charlotte City Councilwoman, where her leadership was instrumental in building the first multi-income housing units, renovating low-income housing projects like Earle Village and Piedmont Courts, and establishing the Housing Trust Fund. Affordable housing has long been her passion, and she was a key figure in creating the Charlotte Mecklenburg Housing Partnership. Following her City Council service, she chaired the Charlotte Housing Authority for six years.

Velva's community service extends even further. She has served as a founding member or board member for numerous organizations,

including the Women's Impact Fund, Charlotte Women of Vision, Good Friends, Lifespan, INREACH, Sugar Creek Charter School, Sharon Towers, Carolinas Medical Center, and the Metropolitan YMCA of Greater Charlotte. She also contributes to the OrthoCarolina Research Institute and Covenant Presbyterian Church, where she serves as Elder Emeritus.

Her leadership and dedication have earned her several prestigious awards, such as the YWCA Women of Achievement Award, Charlotte Woman of the Year, and the Order of the Long Leaf Pine for her work in job training and workforce preparedness during Governor Jim Martin's term.

Velva is also a mother to four adult children and grandmother to ten. She lost her beloved husband, Tom Woollen, in 2022. She continues to leave an indelible mark on the community. *Welcome Velva!*



District Grant Awarded for Rotary Garden Monument Project!


Charlotte Rotary is proud to announce that we have been awarded a District Grant of \$17,680 to install a Rotary Garden Monument in Thompson Park by St. Mary's Chapel along the Sugar Creek Greenway. The garden, shaped like the iconic Rotary wheel and measuring approximately 66 feet in diameter, will help promote Rotary's brand to thousands of visitors. St. Mary's Chapel hosts 5–6 weddings each weekend during the spring, summer, and fall, making this a prime location for increased community visibility.

This project, in partnership with the Catawba Lands Conservancy (CLC) and Mecklenburg County Park and Recreation, will contribute to environmental protection, pollination, and provide a serene space in a bustling urban setting. The garden will be permanently maintained by Parks and Recreation, ensuring its lasting impact on the community.

Almost there!

Since this is a matching grant, fundraising is needed and is making great progress! We've already raised \$45,037.75 toward our \$50,264.25 goal, thanks to the generosity of our members and community partners. 
Western North Carolina Relief


