Patricia Shafer has travelled the world, obtained multiple graduate degrees, and taken on the title of Rotary Peace Fellow. However, how this Charlotte Rotary member became a Global Peace Builder was only the beginning of her presentation to her home club.

The start of her journey in this realm came from encouragement from our own PDG Luther Moore. The former District 7680 Governor was described by Shafer as her own "Mr. Miyagi" - the fictional character played by Pat Morita in the Karate Kid movie

franchise.

It was Moore that first stated, "You could be a Rotary Peace Fellow" to Shafer. That, along with the encouragement to join the club as a member, followed by Moore continuously showing up for every Peace event, was impactful in her journey. It was also indicative of Rotary International and its members advocating for peace through "the fourth object of Rotary" to "promote international understanding, goodwill, and peace."
