D. Craig Horn, President, Churchill Society of North Carolina

Charlotte Rotary Club was pleased to have Craig Horn, President of the Churchill Society of North Carolina serve as our speaker this week. He was introduced by long-time Rotary Member, **Catherine Bracey**.

Catherine shared that Craig was born and raised in Iowa, and after a brief stint as a drummer with The Tracers, he joined the Air Force, where he served as a Russian linguist during the Cold War. He used his skills to listen in on the Russians and report conversations

back to the Department of Defense. Later Craig sold his food business and relocated to Union County, NC where he successfully ran for NC House of Representatives District 68 and held office for five terms. Craig led the efforts to move public education into the digital age and was recognized by the NC Technology Association as the Public Leader of the Year and was later recognized as one of 25 "Ed Tech Heroes" for his work promoting a digital education environment to provide quality education to every student. He was the only elected official in the country to make that list. He served as Weddington's mayor from November 2021 to December 2023. **Click here to read more.**


