This Week's Meeting



Dr. Crystal Hill, CMS Superintendent by Elly Clary

Improved performance through focus on student achievement is a picture the superintendent of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg School System painted for Rotarians.

Dr. Crystal Hill delivered 2023-24 highlights. These include 33 schools with improved state performance grades and a system graduation rate of 84 percent, with notable increases for Hispanic students. For literacy in kindergarten through 2nd grade, the achievement gap between white, Black and Hispanic students shrank.

Hill lauded a CMS partnership with the Charlotte Executive Leadership Council, whose advice led to four student outcome goals for 2024 through 2029. These include a

concentration on early literacy in kindergarten through 2nd grade and on literacy skills in grades 3-8, plus a strengthened math foundation.

"We want to ensure that all students who graduate from CMS schools finish enrolled, enlisted or employed," Hill said in explaining an emphasis on post-graduate readiness. Click here to read more.


