## This Week's Meeting



Ryan Brookhart, Economics of Nuclear Power by Layne McGuire

Tuesday's speaker was Ryan Brookhart, President of Zachary Nuclear. Mr. Brookhart shared insights into nuclear power and its significance in the energy sector. After a twenty-one-year career with the U.S. Navy, Mr. Brookhart retired as a Commander and joined civilian life at Zachary Group in the Nuclear Engineering business unit, where he has held numerous positions. With 35 years of experience, Mr. Brookhart brings a wealth of knowledge about the economic considerations of various power sources and the economic benefits that nuclear power provides for meeting our growing energy needs while benefiting our local communities.

Mr. Brookhart set the stage by providing us with an overview of power generation. The discussion of various power sources, including hydro, coal, natural gas, and nuclear, provided valuable context for the non-engineer Rotarians. He emphasized the importance of base load power sources that provide consistent electricity and can supplement other intermittent renewable sources like wind and solar. In addition, he illustrated how the costs associated with nuclear power plants go back into the community in many ways in the form of high salaries, taxes, and maintenance investments. **Click here to read more.**


